



Tournament rules Basinus Trophy

1. Rules

All matches shall be played in accordance with the laws of the game as laid down by the International Football Association Board, as issued by FIFA and in accordance with the rules of the DFB. The organizing club, above, has received the necessary permission to host the tournament from the DFB. The organizing club shall form an organizing committee (tournament committee) which shall be responsible for all arrangements in connection with the competition.

2. Referees

All matches will be controlled by referees affiliated to the DFB.

3. Teams

Teams approved by their national football association are entitled to participate in this tournament.

4. Team Leader

Every team must be accompanied by an adult (over 18 years of age). The name, address and date of birth of this adult must be printed clearly on his team's registration sheet. This adult will be deemed to be the teamleader and he will responsible for the behavior of his players, on and off the field of play. He will be held other facilities available to the group.

5. Age categories

The date on or after which a player must be born in order to play in a certain age category can be found on the tournament website under 'age categories'.

U19 - U17 - U15 = 11 player, fullsize pitch, offside, goalkeeper is not allowed to take the ball in his hands after back pass

U13 = 9 players, 9-a-side pitch, offside, goalkeeper is not allowed to take the ball in his hands after back pass

U11 = 7 players, 7-a-side pitch, no offside, with back pass

Age Control.

Prior to commencement of the tournament the team leader must submit, to the tournament committee, a registration sheet which contains the full name, date of birth and shirt number of every players in the team. All players must provide proof of their age an identity. They may be asked to show this proof at any time. The same player may participate in only one team during the whole tournament.

6. Duration of Play

All age categories will play 1x25 minutes.



7. Placing matches - preliminary rounds

The final position of the teams in the preliminary rounds will be determined by the number of points attained. The points system applied will be:

- 3 points for a win
- 1 point for a draw
- 0 points for a loss.

Where teams are level on points in their group the following will apply:

1. goal difference,
2. more goals scored,
3. the result of the mutual match,
4. the drawing of lots.

Placing matches - Intermediate rounds. In the event of a draw, penalty kicks will be taken in accordance with the system laid down by the International Football Association board in order to determine the winners.

8. Matches

The team leader has to announce his team at the pitch crew at least 5 minutes before a match. 5 players (including one goalkeeper) according to the players list can be replaced per game. Rotation is allowed, so all substituted players can re-enter the match at any time. A player's replacement is only possible in game-breaks and has been registered and permitted by the referee. In the U11 a quick replacement is permitted during the whole match (unlimited). Each team provides one assistant referee who only flags if the ball is out (no offside!).

9. Jerseys

Every team is obliged to bring a second choice strip of contrasting color. If, according to the referee, before the start of the match, the colors are too similar then the team mentioned first in the programme must change.

10. Discipline

When a player is sent from the field or is given a caution, the tournament committee will be notified immediately after the match by the referee. Any player who has been sent off by red card is not eligible to play in their team's for the rest of the tournament. For unsportsmanlike behavior the referee can expel the player for five minutes. (Time Sanction)

Note. All misconduct reports arising from the tournament will be forwarded to the National Association of the host club who will forward these reports to the National Associations concerned.

In case of the group matches the team loses the match with the result 0-3 in the following cases:

- if that team is late for a game or not available
- if that team uses an ineligible player
- if that referee has to abandon a game due to misconduct of players of that team.



11. Protests

The referee's decision in all matters concerning points of the play shall be final and binding, therefore protests in this area are not accepted. All other protests should be made in the intermediate- and final rounds (if there is no question of group matches) the team concerned loses in the cases mentioned automatically its match with the result 0:3.

12. Shoes

No shoes with screw studs allowed.

13. Match schedules

The organizing committee has the right to alter the match schedule in case of unforeseen circumstances.

14. Responsibility

It is the responsibility of each team to make sure that adequate insurance cover is provided for their players. The tournament organisers and Euro-Sportring are not responsible for damage to, and loss or theft of possessions or equipment of participants or clubs. They are also not responsible for personal harm or injury to participants.
